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The Supportive Housing and Support Services Inventory is a first attempt to identify all of the supportive housing providers and community agencies that provide support services in the District.

Supportive housing providers include non-profit and private organizations that offer housing for individuals who require support services. Also included is a listing of private retirement homes and long-term cares facilities.

Support service agencies include both for profit and not for profit organizations that provide some form of direct assistance to individuals. The assistance may be in the form of direct provision of support services, financial assistance and/or information services. Also included is a list of hospitals and medical clinics.

The information was derived from the data available on the Lakehead Social Planning Council’s 211 information system. Some information was provided by MOHLTC, MMAH and through individual provider or agency websites.

There was inconsistency between data sources, and it is anticipated that through the implementation of Recommended Action 8.1 in the Housing Strategy – Under One Roof it will resolve any discrepancies and build an all-inclusive inventory of supportive housing providers and support service agencies.
