REPORT SUMMARY

To provide The District of Thunder Bay Social Services Administration Board (TBDSSAB or the Board) with information pertaining to the Working Group on Child Care Funding in Rural and Remote Communities (the Working Group).

BACKGROUND

In 2017, the Province announced its Renewed Early Years and Child Care Policy Framework, which contained various initiatives aimed at maintaining and expanding high-quality, accessible, and affordable child care options for families in Ontario.

To help support this plan, and in recognition of the significant barriers experienced by Service Managers and child care providers in rural and remote communities, the Province established the Working Group.

The mandate of the Working Group was to engage and solicit input from key child care sector stakeholders to provide advice and recommendations to the Ministry of Education on:

- Successful practices and delivery challenges in rural and remote communities;
- Rural and remote considerations in the Child Care Funding Formula and the Ontario Child Care and Child and Family Program Service Management and Funding Guideline; and,
- Alignment of child care funding with broader Provincial priorities.

The Working Group was chaired by a representative of the Ministry of Education, and the membership consisted of eight (8) representatives from various Service Managers whose service area was considered predominantly rural or remote. TBDSSAB was represented on this Working Group by Keri Greaves, Manager, Finance.

COMMENTS

The Working Group convened several meetings between September 2017 and March 2018. These meetings provided a forum for members to share experiences, challenges, ideas, and business practices. Representatives from the Ministry of Education attended the meetings to listen, and engage with the group.

Through these discussions, the Working Group developed three (3) recommendations to be presented to the Ministry of Education:

Build a Sustained Rural and Remote Network

 The Working Group provided a valuable opportunity to share ideas and provide feedback to the Ministry. A Sustained Rural and Remote Network would enable further input;

Facilitate ongoing collaboration

 The Province should consult with this Sustained Rural and Remote Network regarding policies under development, to ensure that the concerns of rural and remote communities are considered, and appropriate supports are provided;

Develop service system management resources

 The Sustained Rural and Remote Network would be tasked with creating resources to share best practices and innovative ideas in rural and remote communities.

In a letter (Attachment 1), dated April 25, 2018, the Assistant Deputy Minister, Shannon Fuller, confirmed that the Early Years and Child Care Division of the Ministry of Education has endorsed these recommendations.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no direct financial implications to this report.

CONCLUSION

It is concluded that the Working Group provided a valuable opportunity to share ideas and experiences, as they relate to providing child care and early years' programs in rural and remote communities, and the endorsement of the Working Group's recommendations should be supported.
