



TBDSSAB History

DSSABs Created by Ontario.

47 Service Managers/DSSABs in province. Board initially does not hire staff directly but contracts with 4 muncipalities to deliver service under contract.

Amalgamation of TBDHC with Thunder Bay Community Housing. TBDSSAB becomes sole share holder.



TBDSSAB becomes direct employer of TBDHC staff Move into new headquarters building. New offices opened in Greenstone and Marathon. Responsibility for Early Years program administration



What is a DSSAB?

- DSSABs created by Ontario in 1999
- DSSABs are not local boards or joint local boards of municipalities
- The DSSAB Act legislation sets out:
 - geographic jurisdictions of 10 DSSABs
 - governance and accountability requirements
 - prescribed social services
 - apportionment of costs





TBDSSAB Board Composition

The TBDSSAB Board of Directors consists of fourteen Members who are elected officials. Board members are chosen by their own municipal councils to serve on the Board to represent areas defined in the District Social Services Administration Board Act.

- 1 Representative for each of:
 - Manitouwadge/Marathon
 - Nipigon/Red Rock/Dorion
 - Terrace Bay/Schreiber
 - Greenstone
 - Territory Without Municipal Organization (TWOMO - directly elected by residents/property owners)
- 2 Representatives for: Oliver-Paipoonge /
 Shuniah / O'Connor / Conmee / Gillies / Neebing
- 6 Representatives for: The City of Thunder Bay



Role of the Board of Directors

- Establishes the strategic goals and governing policies for the organization
- Provides direction to the Chief Administrative
 Officer (CAO)
- TBDSSAB Board Meetings: Monthly every 3rd Thursday

TWOMO Election

DSSAB members representing areas within Territories Without Municipal Organization (TWOMO) are selected by qualified electors of that territory through an election for a four-year term.

Elections in TWOMOs are held the same day that municipal elections are held. This year's municipal and TWOMO elections will be held on **October 24, 2022.**

2022 TWOMO Election Timelines

- Nomination Period: ends August 19, 2022
- Nominees Posted: August 22, 2022
- Election Day: October 24, 2022
