REPORT SUMMARY

To provide the District of Thunder Bay Social Services Administration Board (TBDSSAB or the Board) with an annual update on advocacy and engagement activities completed by the Board and/or Administration.

BACKGROUND

The Board approved an Advocacy & Engagement Policy & Procedure in September 2021, by Resolution 21/58.

The purpose of the Advocacy and Engagement Policy and Procedure is to establish a clear and consistent framework to guide The District of Thunder Bay Social Services Administration Board (TBDSSAB or the Board) with the planning, implementation, and tracking of advocacy and engagement activities.

COMMENTS

The table below summarizes initiatives undertaken in 2023. Highlights from 2023 include:

- 1. Housing & Homelessness Program Funding Increase. In April 2023, the province announced a significant increase to Homelessness Prevention Program (HPP) funding, increasing the total allocation to \$16 million. During the media announcement, MPP Kevin Holland acknowledged the advocacy done by the TBDSSAB Board of Directors as a contributing factor for the funding increase.
- 2. Mental Health & Addictions Supports & Partnerships. The need for supports from health-funded agencies for mental health and addictions has been an ongoing topic for TBDSSAB advocacy, including policy advocacy to increase

access to substance use health supports at ROMA 2023. Further to policy advocacy, TBDSSAB also participated in the *Stigma Ends With Me* campaign via the Thunder Bay District Health Unit, sponsored the *Rockin' Recovery* event via Thunder Bay Drug Strategy, and were included as part of the *A Sobering Story* documentary in 2023.

3. **Reconciliation & Inclusion.** In 2023, TBDSSAB presented the Board with a proposed Implementation Plan based on the recommendations in the 2022 Situation Analysis via Blue Sky. This led to the formation of an ad hoc Board Committee and the passing of most of the items in the implementation plan in the fall. TBDSSAB also hosted a drumming event in honour of National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and raised flags at HQ in recognition of Pride Month and the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation.
