Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) Update



January 1, 2025 - CWELCC was updated with a new Cost-Based Funding formula by the Ministry with new guidelines for eligibility and a shift from a revenue-based funding to a cost-based funding approach



March 31, 2025 – TBDSSAB was provided with newly recalibrated Direct Growth Targets for 2025 and 2026



Early Learning Child Care Infrastructure Funding, new funding to support the expansion and growth of the CWELCC spaces was provided by the Ministry



Capacity Building Process began in September 2023 and is continuing into this year as a measure to support programs by ensuring high quality standards

196 New Licensed Child Care Spaces by December 2026 or sooner



New partnerships to be announced once service agreements are signed as well as expansion from programs with current service agreements



New funding provided through the Ministry through Start Up Grants, Capital Early Learning and Child Care Infrastructure Funding and Innovation Funding Proposals



Professional Learning Plans



In May, a Saturday event was held in partnership with the Confederation College ECE faculty, the Children and Family Centre, and Dr. Edward Rawana from Lakehead University NOSM



A full day professional learning session is planned for October 24 for the District of Thunder Bay Child Care and EarlyON sector



Currently in discussion to provide an online speaker series to be available to all educators in partnership with some regional DSSABs



An evening session for all families within the licensed child care programs will be held in early November




Child Care Fee Subsidy

TBDSSAB Child Care Workers are responsible for:


- assessing and determining financial eligibility for child care fee subsidy
- monitoring attendance for fee subsidy children
- conducting annual site visits to review/audit attendance for care code rates in OCCMS for accuracy
- attending TBDSSAB hubs for fee subsidy appointments and door knocking to promote children's services

How to Apply for Child Care

If parents are interested in applying for childcare, they must apply online at www.thunderbaychildcare.ca





In what situations are subsidies approved?

Child Care Fee Subsidy is available to families who are:

Engaged in employment activities (i.e. employed, self-employed) OR Attending school or job specific training OR Referred through an agency for special, social, or medical needs AND Qualify under the income test (all families on OW and ODSP automatically meet the eligibility of income testing)

Child Care – Current Statistics as of August 2025

3,057 licensed child care spaces 2,144 unique children in care 1,177 full time space equivalents 444 in receipt of fee subsidy

25,670 children visits

19,690 parent / caregiver visits

2,933 children served






EarlyON Program Update

- Mobile units in community spaces have been very successful in meeting the needs of some of the most vulnerable populations
- There has been a substantial increase in usage of EarlyON programs over the past year
- EarlyON bridges the gap between the lack of child care spaces and access to socialization for young children
- The Ministry recognizes these programs as beneficial to all communities especially to the Northern communities that do not have access to licensed child care programs


Child Care Waitlist






Licensed Spaces
